Use this guide to consolidate learning at home. You can ask your children a range of questions regarding what they have been learning about at school e.g. “Who was Florence Nightingale?” “How did the Fire of London start?” “What are the differences between now and the Stone Age?” “What did the Ancient Greeks believe?” “What is Alfred the Great famous for?” “What species did Darwin discover?”

Over the half term, you could talk to your child about their ‘Autumn 2’ themes. There are many museums and galleries in London (that are free for both you and your child). Visiting museums gives children an opportunity to see a wide variety of artefacts before their topic begins. In addition, a walk around the local area can also inspire enquiry skills.
