Dear Parents and Carers,

You will now have received the curriculum newsletter for the second half of the Autumn Term. These detail the learning for the year group including PE days. Physical Education (PE) is a statutory part of the curriculum and essential for both physical and mental well-being. Please ensure your child has their full kit each week to enable them to access the learning comfortably and safely.

As we move towards the month of December, we have a range of seasonal events and concerts lined up. Please look out for posters and information on our website and school gates. Each year group will be performing a selection of themed songs at a sing-a-long to which parents are invited. Nursery and Reception classes will undertake a traditional performance which is always very popular so please make sure you arrive in good time. We will of course be teaching a full timetable until the holidays to ensure no day is wasted and children are expected to attend school every day until we break up on Friday 16th December 2022 at 2pm.

Keeping safe is a theme which is constant in our curriculum, including staying safe online and knowing to speak up if there is something which is worrying or seems wrong. Online safety is something which many parents are concerned about. One of the best ways to help young people stay safe online is to talk to them about what they do. If you understand the situations they encounter you will be better placed to offer them advice on how to deal with them. Reception places are allocated in a cross-London scheme which is organised by our local authority, Hackney Education, not the school. If you have a child who was born between 1st September 2018 to 31st August 2019 then you will need to make an application for a Reception place regardless of whether your child attends our Nursery or has a sibling already in the school. Our Reception classes are very popular so do not miss the deadline for these applications which is Tuesday 15th January 2023. Reception class have learnt about the country, Kenya and what life is like for people who live in a small village by reading the story book 'Handa's Surprise'. Hunting Sounds

Year 2 are looking at Electricity in science this half term. Last week, children took part in a sound hunt to identify and describe different sounds around the school using their scientific vocabulary such as faint, loud, repeating and high-pitched.



British Museum Trip

Year 4 had a fantastic day visiting the British Museum last term. They learnt all about Ancient Greece and studied pottery and artefacts to explore their beliefs and lifestyle. They also had an opportunity to answer questions about Greek gods and goddesses, as well as exploring what life was like a child decades ago.



EYFS Remembrance Day

Reception class took part in a Remembrance Day carpet time, discussing the importance of 11th of November and how we wear poppies as a symbol of remembrance. The children then took part in various activities such as painting and printing poppies.



Reading Champions

Our Reading Champions have gotten off to a great start; carrying out surveys in all KS1 and KS2 classes, attending a virtual meeting with Reading Champions from other schools in the borough, and sharing ideas and recommended books to one another. 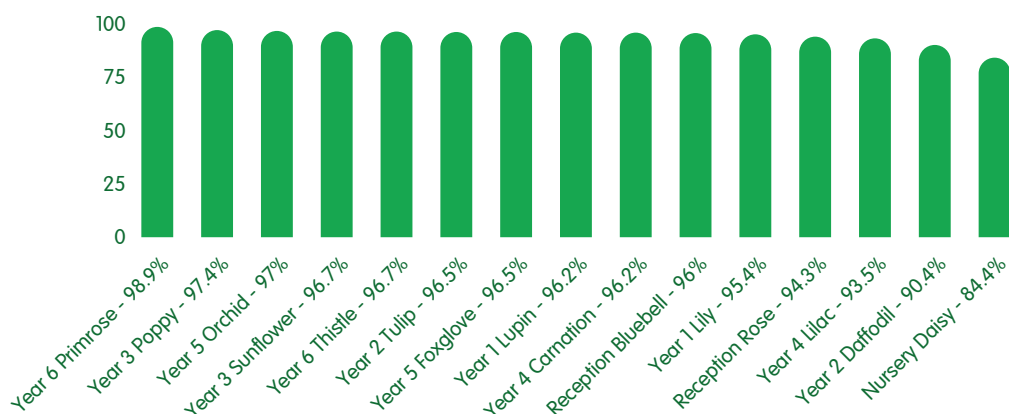
