Dates for your diary

Homework

Your child will bring home two reading books every week. One will be their phonics reading book and the other will be their banded reading book. Please read with your child for 10 minutes every night and write a comment in their home school diary.

Spare Clothes

We ask that all children come to school in pants (no nappies or pull-ups please). A set of spare clothes can be brought in and left on your child's peg in case of any accidents. Please can all clothes be labelled.

Our topic this half term is My Home, Your Home



Communication and Language

We will be:

- Learning many rhymes, being able to talk about familiar books, and being able to tell a long story.
- Developing our communication, but may continue to have problems with irregular tenses and plurals.
- Using talk to organise ourselves and our play: "Let's go on a bus... You sit there... I'll be the driver."



Literacy

We will be developing our phonological awareness so that we can:

- Spot and suggest rhymes;
- Count or clap syllables in a word;
- Recognise words with the same initial sound, such as money and mother.



Maths

We will be learning to:

- Talk about and explore 2D and 3D shapes (eg. circles, rectangles and triangles).
- Understand position through words alone and not actions e.g. "The bag is under the table," without pointing.
- Make comparisons between objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity.
- Talk about and identify the patterns around us e.g. stripes on clothes, and designs on rugs and wallpaper.



Physical Development

We will be learning to:

- Start taking part in some group activities which we make up for ourselves, or in teams.
- Choose the right resources to carry out our own plan e.g. choosing a spade to enlarge a small hole we dig with a trowel.
- Use one-handed tools and equipment, for example, making snips in paper with scissors.



Understanding the World

We will be learning to:

- Talk about the differences between materials and changes we notice.
- Know that there are different countries in the world, and talk about the differences we have experienced or seen in photos.
- Continue developing positive attitudes about the differences between people



Expressive Art and Design

We will be learning to:

- Create closed shapes with continuous lines, and begin to use these shapes to represent objects.
- Explore colour and colour-mixing.
- Listen with increased attention to sounds.
- Remember and sing entire songs.



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will be learning to:

- Increasingly follow rules, understanding why they are important.
- Develop appropriate ways of being assertive.
- Talk about our feelings using words like 'happy', 'sad', 'angry' or 'worried'.
