What is world week?

- World Week is a part of our enrichment programme, which specifically delves into and celebrates the diversity within our schools. It creates opportunities to explore relevant global issues and topics, linking National Curriculum subjects in a cross-curricular way. It provides a context for pupils to acquire, develop and apply a broad range of knowledge, understanding and skills.




Our World: Our Responsibility

- The aim of the week is for children to gain an awareness of their own role in protecting the planet they live in, from the impact they can have in their local environment, to how their actions contribute to the health of the wider world. The children will investigate various projects – from local to global, depending on key stage - focussing on how they can contribute/ support the efforts.

Year 1	Growing fruit and veg	<p>What fruits and vegetables can we grow in the UK? How does this help? Where do our fruit and vegetables come from? Where is it grown? Year 2	Rewilding	<p>What is rewilding? Why is it important not to use chemicals? What happens when we cut back insect habitats/green spaces? How does rewilding help the insect population?</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children to visit a 'wild common area' and look at plants and insects Children to create a poster to encourage rewilding and less use of chemicals

Year 4	Plastics and water	<p>What happens to our waste? What ways does plastic enter the sea? What are single use plastics and what is their impact on the world? https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/z4d62v4#zttb3j6</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children to create an information sheet: How is plastic harmful? What can we do?
Year 5	Reuse and Repurpose	<p>Throw away culture How can we avoid waste? How can we reuse instead of throwing away? Where else could rubbish be sent?</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Look at charity shops – where could clothes/money from clothes be sent? Children to repurpose an old item into something new e.g. a bag with a set of instructions
Year 6	Global Contribution	<p>G6 conferences: What are the agreements across governments and countries? Who attends the G6 conferences? What does that mean for us? What can we do to impact the future?</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Debate Writing a letter outcome to G6 conference
