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#### ONLINE SAFETY FEDERATION ANNUAL REVIEW



To ensure an effective and robust ICT provision, we have regularly reviewed and updated the teaching and learning materials to reflect the latest trends and threats in the digital world. This has been implemented in line with national curriculum standards, and through feedback from pupils, parents/carers, and staff.

Additionally, we have invited external experts such as the Three Discovery team to deliver workshops and seminars to further enhance pupil understanding of online safety. Recognising the importance of parental involvement, we have organised workshops and information sessions for parents/carers, providing resources and guidance on how to support their child in navigating the online world safely. We have also encouraged open communication between parents/carers and teachers so that any concerns or incidents could be addressed promptly.

To monitor the progress of our online safety efforts, we have established dedicated online safety teams across the federation in the form of our pupil Digital Leaders and staff ICT Leads. The teams have regularly reviewed the implementation of our online safety and well-being policies, conducting evaluations to gauge pupil knowledge and awareness, and analysing incident reports to identify any gaps in their approach. The team have also engaged in cross-site collaboration to share best practices and learn from each other's experiences.

We have identified a significant improvement in our pupils' online safety awareness and behaviour; they have become vigilant when using online platforms and can clearly articulate this to their teachers, parents/carers and peers.

As we continue our journey, we remained steadfast in our commitment to online safety as we understand that the digital landscape is ever-evolving. We will continue to stay updated with the latest guidance and expectations, ensuring that our pupils, staff and the wider community are equipped with the knowledge and skills to navigate the online world safely.

#### **DIGITAL LEADERS HARD AT WORK**





The Digital Leaders across the federation have been diligently carrying out the responsibilities of their role. They have been carefully counting devices and making sure they are stored correctly and safely. When using devices in the classroom, the Digital Leaders have been delivering key internet safety messages to their class to remind them how to stay safe online. Another key role for the Digital Leaders this year has been modelling and explaining key vocabulary during their computing lessons, they have supported their peers to understand their learning and use technical vocabulary.
