Dear Parents and Carers,

We teach children the risks of being online but it is important that you monitor your children's use of the internet and how they are connecting with the outside world to make sure that they are safe. Making sure our school sites are safe and secure is a constant priority for us. The end of the school day is a very busy time when the school gates are necessarily open. Although we have members of the senior team stationed at exits, please could all parents ensure that they collect their children from the line in the playground and not before, letting the adults know that they have been collected. We have also recently reviewed our emergency management policy, so that we are prepared in case of a major incident outside of the school which means that we have to keep exits closed. In this exceptional situation we would send all parents a text to inform them that the school has entered a 'lock down' and no one will be permitted to enter or leave the building. In the highly unusual situation, please be assured that the intention is to ensure that everyone remains safe.

Please support them with this by making sure that tasks are completed and children have the opportunity to read and talk about their learning at home. Knowing times tables is particularly helpful, along with telling the time on both analogue and digital clocks, counting money and of course sharing a book.

Capacity

Following on from their Maths topic of capacity, children in EYFS used different containers to carry out different investigations. They looked at which containers held more water and were then able to use mathematical language of full, empty, half full.



Counting Steps

In Maths, Year 1 are learning about position. They explored the concept of 'forwards' and 'backwards' by using a twister matt. The children really enjoyed this and were all able to go listen to the instructions such as 'move backwards by 3 steps'.



Making Terrariums

This week, Year 4 took part in a gardening workshop. They used their green fingers to create beautiful terrariums which were first invented by the Victorians in 1842. They enjoyed learning more about Victorian advancements as well as the science behind the micro ecosystems that are created inside the sealed jars.


Attendance
