<b>E-safety messages</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>What are your key e-safety messages for this term?</b></li> <li>• Year 6 – Do not talk to strangers online – Avoid clicking on links that you are unsure of the source</li> <li>• Year 5 – Do not give out personal details to anyone</li> <li>• Year 4 – Be careful what you post online so that you keep our information safe</li> <li>• Year 3 - if you see something that makes you feel funny, tell an adult</li> </ul>	Remind your teacher to give you the time to share your messages at the beginning of each lesson – Digital Leaders
<b>Cyber bullying</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>What is cyber bullying and how do you deal with it?</b></li> <li>• Year 6 – P and P box deals with some online safety issues. For example: Clicked on a link and now they are receiving messages from a stranger</li> <li>• Year 5 – We discussed cyberbullying and how it affects others</li> <li>• Year 4- We can use it to report problems online and the teacher and the class can give us advice</li> <li>• Year 3 – sometimes there are problems being dealt with from the box</li> </ul>	JJ – Reminder to teachers to include e-safety scenarios in the weekly circle time

<p><b>Staying safe online across the curriculum</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● <b>How do teachers help you/teach you to stay safe online?</b></li> <li>● We learned about issues around staying safe during computing lessons by ensuring we know the person we are interacting with online</li> <li>● AI can be used in the school, workplace or as a prospective career. However, AI is not always reliable, it is not human!</li> <li>● We did an EMW activity to give advice to someone who needs help with using their devices safely</li> <li>● In PSHCE lessons we talk about things like phishing, fake news and being able to judge sources reliability</li> <li>● In classes, we also learned about how technology has changed over time</li> <li>● Assemblies with Deputy heads are based on keeping safe online and being up standers and reporting to adults</li> <li>● Parents attended a coffee morning on keeping their children safe online at home</li> <li>● Digital leaders have delivered assemblies around e-safety</li> </ul>	<p>No action</p>
