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### Dear Parents and Carers,

Next week we will be celebrating World Week and Democracy Day. World Week celebrates the diversity within our partnership of schools and creates opportunities to explore relevant global issues and for children to gain an understanding of themselves as global citizens. The theme for World Week this year will be 'sustaining our world'. Children will gain an awareness of their own role in protecting the planet they live in, from the impact they can have in their local environment, to how their actions contribute to the health of the wider world. The children will investigate a cause, and effect and sustainable solutions to the climate crisis the planet is currently facing. World Week will incorporate a number of events such as international evening, democracy day, cultural workshops, national dress day and the launch into Black History Month. We are very excited to welcome external visitors who will undertake a range of dance workshops including Flamenco, Morris and African dancing! We also elected the new members of our school pupil council, who meet weekly. A reminder that international dress day and international evening will be taking place on Thursday 17th October. We are looking forward to seeing children in their cultural dress and sampling dishes from across the globe. We are so fortunate to be able to celebrate so many different cultures that make London a proud global city!

The first half term has gone by very quickly, with school breaking up for half term on Friday 25th October 2024 at 3:30pm. Children return on Monday 4th November 2024 at 8.55am. During the first few weeks of the school year we have again been focusing on key skills such as reading confidently and with understanding as well as knowledge of key maths skills such as pairs of numbers that add to 10,100,1000 and essential confidence in times tables facts. 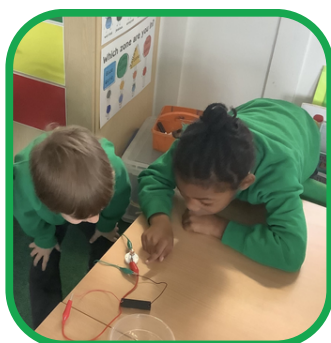
### Early Writing

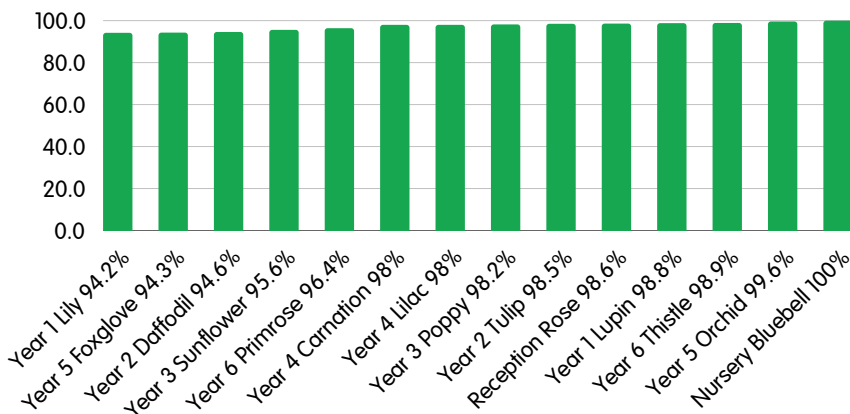
## Attendance
