Dear Parents and Carers,

This week has been World Week, which delves into and celebrates the diversity within our schools. It creates opportunities to explore relevant global issues and topics, linking National Curriculum subjects in a cross-curricular way. It also provides a context for pupils to acquire, develop and apply abroad range of knowledge, understanding and skills. The theme for World Week this year will be 'One Community; The Gifts That We Bring.' Children have had the opportunity to explore the many ways in which diverse cultures have enriched our shared lives; from the gift of language, storytelling, to music, food, traditions and inventions that shape the Britain that we know today. Pupils have learnt how these 'gifts' help build stronger, more united communities where everyone's contribution is valued. A huge thank you to everyone that came along to support International Evening this year.

We also celebrated Democracy Day across the school! Each class voted for their new class and school council representatives. Year 6 pupils worked especially hard, creating posters and flyers and giving speeches as they campaigned to become Head Boy and Head Girl. It was a brilliant example of democracy in action, showing one of the key British Values we learn about in school. Pupils learned the importance of having a voice, making fair choices and respecting others' opinions. Well done to everyone who took part and voted!

Next month (November) will also be Black History Month across our schools. The theme this year is 'Standing Firm in Power and Pride' and through weekly assemblies, children will learn about the strength and resilience of Black communities worldwide. Look out for updates on our social media and websites!

Last of all... during these first few weeks of the school year, we have been focussing on key skills such as reading confidently and with understanding, as well as building writing staming. We have also been practising knowledge of key maths skills such as pairs of numbers that add to 10,100,1000 and essential confidence in times tables facts. Please support us by making sure that children practise skills at home too including the use of Mathletics, Timestable Rockstars and reading for 10 minutes each evening. There are some tips in home reading diaries on how you can support your child. You can also speak to your child's class teacher who will be happy to help.


Attendance
