Dear Parents and Carers,

At Viridis, we value every child's ideas and believe their voices matter. Our Pupil Voice groups give children the opportunity to take responsibility, develop leadership skills and help improve school life for everyone. Through these groups, pupils learn teamwork, confidence and how to make positive changes in their community. We have a range of roles including Peer Mediators who help develop playground friendships, Librarians who promote a love of reading, Language Captains who help us learn Spanish, Junior Road Safety Officers who encourage safe travel and Digital Leaders who support safe and responsible technology use. These groups empower pupils to lead by example. Parents can find out more about their important work on our website.

You will often hear our staff saying that 'reading is the gateway to all learning'. We aim to change home reading books at least once a week (more often for younger children), and returning home readers to school will help us to do this. We make sure that children have a wide selection of books to choose from but the breadth of books available reduces when these are left at home. Please could you check for any school home reading books that may have slipped behind the sofa or under the bed, pop them in your child's book bag or give them directly to any member of staff during morning drop off.

Children are expected to know all of their multiplication tables by the end of Year 4, and they will benefit hugely from any support you can provide at home. Quick recall of times tables builds confidence and supports learning in many areas of maths. All children in Years 3 to 6 have been given a password to access Times Table Rock Stars, our online programme designed to make practising fun and engaging. Please encourage your child to use this regularly. You can also help at home by practising little and often while walking to school or at home. Chant tables together, use flashcards or spot multiplication in real life (e.g. "4 plates with 3 carrots each"). Short, frequent practice makes a big difference!

It just leaves us to wish you a wonderful half term break. We look forward to seeing the children returning with their holiday homework projects in just over a week. Please remember that school will reopen at the usual time of 8.55am on Monday 23rd February.

Pointillism

As part of their Art unit focusing on the work of Georges Seurat, Year 1 have been exploring the pointillism technique. The children learned how artists can use small dots of colour to create pictures and experimented with this method in their own artwork.



Investigating Yeast

As part of their micro-organism topic, Year 6 investigated the most effective conditions to activate yeast. They carried out their investigation, made observations and drew conclusions. Their results demonstrated that the blood temperature water was had the most vigorous reaction!


Attendance
